2. Those who hide their sin will one day be _____.

⁹ “**Woe to him who builds his house by unjust gain, setting his nest on high to escape the clutches of ruin! . . .** ¹¹ The stones of the wall will cry out, and the beams of the woodwork will echo it.”

Habakkuk 2:9, 11

3. Those who build a kingdom by injustice will end up with _____.

¹² “**Woe to him who builds a city with bloodshed and establishes a town by injustice!** ¹³ Has not the LORD Almighty determined that the people’s labor is only fuel for the fire, that the nations exhaust themselves for nothing? ¹⁴ For the earth will be filled with the knowledge of the glory of the LORD as the waters cover the sea.” Habakkuk 2:12-14

4. Those who shame others will one day be _____.

¹⁵ “**Woe to him who gives drink to his neighbors, pouring it from the wineskin till they are drunk, so that he can gaze on their naked bodies!** ¹⁶ You will be filled with shame instead of glory. Now it is your turn! Drink and let your nakedness be exposed! The cup from the LORD’s right hand is coming around to you, and disgrace will cover your glory.” Habakkuk 2:15-16

5. Those who bow to idols will always stand _____.

¹⁸ “Of what value is an idol carved by a craftsman? Or an image that teaches lies? For the one who makes it trusts in his own creation; he makes idols that cannot speak. ¹⁹ **Woe to him who says to wood, ‘Come to life!’ Or to lifeless stone, ‘Wake up!’** Can it give guidance? It is covered with gold and silver; there is no breath in it.”

²⁰ The LORD is in his holy temple; let all the earth be silent before him.
